Summary Record of NSC Executive Committee Meeting No. 35 December 11, 1962 -- 10:00 AM

A State Department paper entitled "U.S. Short Term Policy Toward Brazil" (copy attached) was presented by Ambassador Gordon. Following the discussion, the President accepted Alternative C of the paper, i.e., to seek to change the political and economic orientation of Brazilian President Goulart and his Government.

The Attorney General will go to Brazil as an emissary. He is going to Panama and Goulart could invite him to come on to Rio.

The President made the point that we should tie in economic aid with the loan decision, making clear to the political leaders in Brazil that economic matters could not be separated from political orientation of the Brazilian Government. The Attorney General should be as specific as possible in his discussions with Goulart.

Mr. Bowles urged that the Attorney General push for reform rather than defending the status quo. If the talks became public we would be in a good position of having argued for reform. The President said that we should not get into a public posture of protecting U.S. companies.


